SCHOOLS COORDINATORS – NT, NSW/ACT, SA, TAS, WA, VIC

As a Schools Coordinator with War Child Australia, you will be responsible for liaising with teachers/librarians/other staff at primary and secondary schools in your state, to:

- answer their questions about War Child's work
- support them in raising funds for War Child through initiatives such as the War Child reading challenges
- where possible, assist with teaching resources to bring War Child into the classroom.

From time to time you will speak to groups of staff or students about War Child's work.

You will maintain an email distribution list of interested people, and periodically email updates about War Child's work and schools initiatives.

Building and maintaining relationships is integral to War Child Australia's work. We do not carry public liability insurance, and therefore cannot put on events. We rely on individuals, schools and other organisations to put on events in support of War Child.

There will also be opportunities to become involved in other aspects of War Child Australia's work.

The role requires approx. 2-3 hours/week, although it does vary. If possible, 12 months commitment is preferred.

Requirements:

- Current or past work experience in the educational sector, either in a school environment or as a service provider to schools.
- A reliable computer with Internet access.
- Strong oral and written communication skills.
- Willingness to obtain a Working with Children Check ("blue card") (Queensland), police check, or your state's equivalent.
